

## NOS bakelite european SCHUKO AC power plugs in detail









## **First Side**



The K with the lightning bolt underneath is the old symbol of the german based KOPP company (<a href="www.kopp.eu">www.kopp.eu</a>)

The N within the closed circle = NEMKO (Norges Elektriske Materiellkontrol), a certification mark from Norway

The third symbol on the right is the KEMA-KEUR (Naamloze Vennootschap tot Keuring van Electrotechnische Materialien), a certification mark from the Netherlands

## **Second Side**



The symbol on the left is the german VDE certification mark (Verband Deutscher Elektrotechniker e. V., Frankfurt am Main/Offenbach) The 614 imprint is of unknown origin, maybe it is the forerunner of the now actual DIN EN 614 (security standards of cables and plugs) or an internal product code of the KOPP company for this specific plug. The second symbol on the right means: certified for max. 250 volts / 16 amperes AC
